LESSON OBJECTIVE

THE WAYFINDER WHY

Why is it important to seek and understand other perspectives?

When we understand why people have certain opinions or hold a certain perspective, we're better able to relate to them and build connections with them.

- + In the next lesson, we'll consider how small, positive interactions have a big impact on our overall sense of belonging and connection to one another.




Find Your Path Career Interest Inventory


